


The Project SEARCH at Jefferson Health Quarterly Newsletter



Project SEARCH at Jefferson Health has been named the winner of an international Project SEARCH award in the category of Innovative Employment. The Spotlight on Innovative Employment recognizes teams that develop quality jobs and rewarding careers that make use of the skills and experience participants gained in their internships. The Project SEARCH leadership team — which selected the winners — was particularly impressed with the examples of hired Project SEARCH graduates working on the front lines of the COVID-19 response at Jefferson.
