SIGNINGINTERNS LEARN NEW SKILLS IN 12CELEBRATIONSHOSPITAL DEPARTMENTS

Project SEARCH at Jefferson Health welcomed 13 interns during two Signing Celebrations on September 11 at Jefferson Cherry Hill and Stratford Hospitals. The internship is the cornerstone of Project SEARCH. During the program year, each intern participates in three 11-week internship rotations in hospital departments where competitive, marketable, and transferable skills are learned. Interns are about halfway through their first rotation, which began October 1 and runs until December 23. Project SEARCH interns are supported on-site by two teams of professionals from Y.A.L.E. School and Samost Jewish Family and Children's Service (JFCS). The Cherry Hill team includes Ernie Laux, Special Education Teacher, and Kelly Almasy, Assistant Teacher and Skills Trainer, both from Y.A.L.E., and Maria DeStafanis-Turner, Skills Trainer from JFCS. The Stratford team includes Beth Kaplan, Special Education Teacher, and Margaret Smith, Assistant Teacher and Skills Trainer, both from Y.A.L.E, and Shannen Murphy, Skills Trainer from JFCS. In addition to the on-site team is Janeene Martin, JFCS Project SEARCH Job Developer, who is often at one of the Jefferson Health program sites helping graduates find jobs or coaching new hires.

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During the celebrations, all interns committed to working hard each day to prepare for gainful employment at the end of the program, either at Jefferson Health or at another employer in the community. The Project SEARCH programs at Jefferson Stratford Hospital and Jefferson Cherry Hill Hospital are administered by Y.A.L.E. School in partnership with Jefferson Health, Samost Jewish Family and Children's Service, NJ Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services, and NJ Division of Developmental Disabilities. Six young adults are participating at Jefferson Stratford Hospital and seven are participating at Jefferson Cherry Hill Hospital.

INTERNS COMPLETE JEFFERSON ORIENTATION IN PREPARATION FOR DEPARTMENT ROTATIONS

In the first few weeks of the program, the on-site teams lead the interns through Jefferson Health's orientation, including topics from Human Resources, Security, HIPAA, Patient Experience, and Infectious Diseases. Ernie, pictured below with Mary Miller from Infection Control, may look ready for Halloween, but he is actually being tested for germs. The onsite team also teaches resume writing and interview skills to prepare interns for interviewing with several department managers who agree to host an intern during the first rotation. Patricia and Tymeir, pictured below, are practicing interview skills together in the training room at the Cherry Hill hospital. Once the interns start in their departments, the onsite teams are "on the move" throughout the hospitals, teaching new skills, monitoring progress, and addressing challenges. An important part of their role is identifying skills that interns can learn within each department to prepare them for employment upon graduation. The team analyzes tasks, prepares instructions, develops task lists, creates supports, and identifies natural supports within each department.


